More details will follow as they are received. Alternatively email Kanno Shihan direct with any questions you may have .

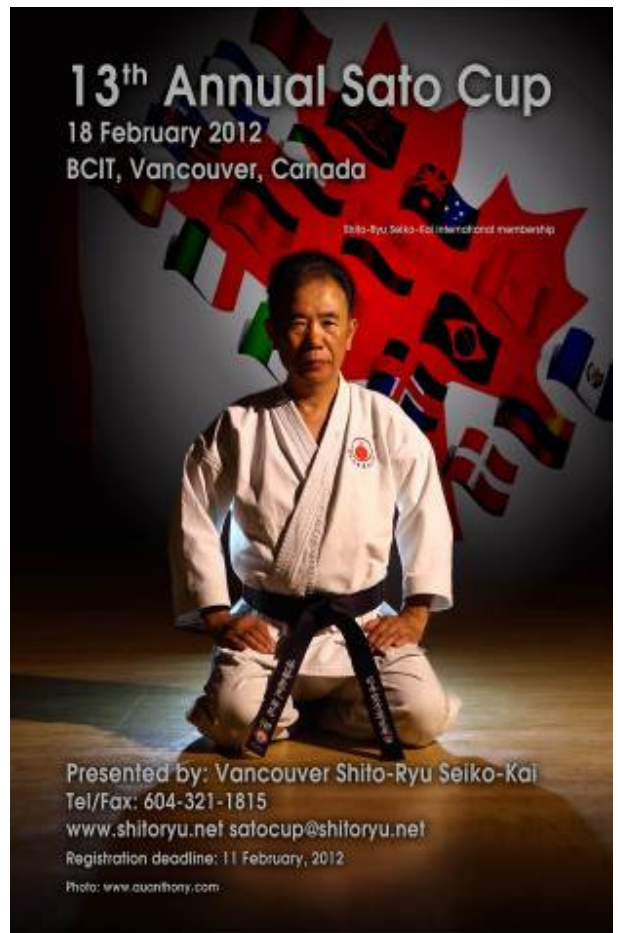

In its first year they have spent time on development and structure of the governance of the body which will represent the prestigious Seikokai brand in the United Kingdom.

As a direct result of their dedicated hard work their team have been successful in being granted direct membership as a Karate Association by the only recognised National Governing Body for Karate in England, the EKF (English Karate Governing Body).

This achievement was only achieved after much consultation and provision of evidence that our policies, structures, management systems, pedigree and personal achievements were deemed worthy of acceptance, but ESKA was accepted as an official entity by the English Governing Body (EKF) which is fantastic news for Seikokai here and Internationally as it puts them in direct links with over 90,000 UK members of the EKF!

Naturally this wider EKF Community will be able to tap into England Seikokai and visa versa, thus new social networks and links will be established. In addition ESKA members can now officially be regarded as representatives for England in any WKF, EKF or EKF competitions.

The EKF web site have now registered their Seikokai division on their web site (see link below) and when their own ESKA web site is completed in mid February, links to the BC Seikokai and Hombu Site in Japan, will be accessible to all EKF members.
